THE EFFECTS OF TRAUMA AND ADVERSITY

Adversity is common - nearly 2 out of 3 adults report having experienced at least one potentially traumatic event before age 18. Research shows that trauma can profoundly affect the developing brain and body, leading to lifelong physical, developmental, and mental health problems.



TRAUMA-INFORMED CARE IS RELATIONAL CARE

Trauma-informed care is an approach that can be used with ALL children and families. Care is provided within a framework that promotes safe, stable, and nurturing relationships and environments (SSNREs), which are critical to building resilience and promoting healthy mental development.


